New WaterConnect

WaterConnect is South Australia's water information portal that provides access to information and data about the condition and use of the State's water resources.

The enhanced site includes a wide range of water data and technical information from across South Australian Government, including new topics such as Flood Awareness and the Finding Long-term Outback Water Solutions Initiative (FLOWS).

WaterConnect is managed by the Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources, who work closely with project partners, including the Bureau of Meteorology, Environment Protection Authority, Department of Manufacturing, Innovation, Trade and Resources and Energy, Goyder Institute for Water Research, Murray-Darling Basin Authority, Primary Industries and Regions SA and SA Water, to provide the most comprehensive online library of water data and technical information available in South Australia.

Navigating WaterConnect

WaterConnect includes a range of new features making it easier to find water related information and data.

Menu providing access to key interests and associated topics.

I'm looking for... quick links to frequently visited topics and tools on WaterConnect.

Site-wide search enables you to select a scope targeting, e.g. only publications or only data systems.

Map search enables fast searches for region specific information and data by clicking a Natural Resource Management (NRM) region on the map.

Search by location enables you to target a search by typing a location name or selecting an NRM Region by name. Alternatively, click Advanced Map Search to select, e.g. a prescribed region.
